It was very good! There were 2 missionary families there and one couple. It was good to fellowship with them and get to know them a little bit. They also had a little monkey there which was a big attraction!! We got worried when we got back on the bus to leave because our air conditioning gave out just as we were pulling up to the house. Once we started moving though the breeze was absolutely wonderful. Some of us wished it had gone out long before!

We then headed to The Canopy Tour in a rain forest. Most of us participated, but a few stayed behind. We hiked uphill about 20 minutes and then came to narrow little walkways suspended high above the trees! There were 7 different little bridges with small platforms in between them. We had to walk on them one at a time and the more people on at a time, the wobblier it became. Despite bouncing all around though, the view was beautiful!

We then started our long trek back home. We stopped at a restaurant at a hotel on the way home for dinner. Ron had called ahead earlier in the day so our food was ready to go! We enjoyed rice, chicken, fries, and fanta! The servings of rice were huge; I'm not sure if anyone could finish it, it sure was good though.

We piled back on the bus and headed to TJ's house so we could drop off all the guys since it was on the way home. The rest of the trip home seemed pretty quick after that. It was still pretty damp from just finishing up raining so there wasn't as much dust flying around everywhere! A lot of us took naps or were at least resting our eyes for much of the last part home. Riding in a bus for the majority of the day on bumpy roads is exhausting! We're looking forward to sleeping in a little in the morning and preparing to get back to the weekday schedule!
